## WHAT A FOOL LOOKS LIKE Feelesiastes 10:12-20

MAIN IDEA: A fool is revealed by what he says and how he leads.

What a fool looks like . . .

- I. IN THE WORDS THAT HE SAYS (Eccl. 10:12-15)
  - A. His words do great damage (10:12).
    - The words of the wise are gracious (10:12a).
    - The words of the fool are destructive (10:12b).
      - > To others (cp. Prov. 12:18; 25:18)
      - > To himself (Eccl. 10:12; cp. Prov. 13:3; 21:23)
  - B. His words make no sense (10:13).
    - There is a pointlessness in his speech: it doesn't make sense.
    - There is a *progression* in his speech: from foolishness to wicked *madness* (*insanity*).
  - C. His words have no end (10:14a; cp. 5:3; Prov. 10:19).
    - There is a lack of meaningful content.
    - There is a lack of self-control.
  - D. His words make empty boasts (10:14b-15).
    - He doesn't know *what* will happen in the *future* (10:14b; cp. 3:22; 6:12; 8:7; 9:12; Jas. 4:13-17; Luke 12:16-20).
    - He doesn't know where he is going in the present (10:15).
- II. IN THE WAY THAT HE LEADS (Eccl. 10:16-20)
  - A. The foolishness of the leaders over the people (10:16-19)

    Characteristics of foolish leaders:
    - Childish *immaturity* (10:16a; cp. Isa. 3:4-5, 12)
      - > Not referring to age, but to youthful immaturity
      - > A sign of judgment on a nation (cp. Isa. 3:4-5, 12)
    - Selfish *indulgence* (10:16b-17; cp. Isa. 5:11)
      - The curse on the land when the rulers are given to indulgence (10:16b; cp. Isa. 5:11)
      - > The blessing on the land when the rulers are under control (10:17)
    - Destructive idleness (10:18)
      - > The indulgence leads to idleness.
      - > The results of such leadership are destructive.
    - Materialistic indifference (10:19)
      - > Indulgence and idleness lead to indifference to the task and the needs of the people.
      - > They live for all that money can buy.
  - B. The foolishness of the people toward the leaders (10:20)
    - Be careful what you *say* and *think* about leaders (cp. Ex. 22:28; cp. Rom. 13:1-7; I Pet. 2:13-17).
    - Realize that what you say secretly may be broadcast publicly.
- \* Be careful what you say to others: be wise, not foolish, in your speech.
- \* Be careful how you lead others: be wise as a leader and as one being led.
