#### I. WHAT GOD PROVIDES FOR VICTORY (James 4:6a)

- A. The same God who jealousy demands our loyalty (4:5) also provides the grace to maintain that loyalty (4:6a).
- B. The grace that He provides is exactly what we need.
  - > This grace is for those who are not worthy: undeserved favor (cp. 4:1-5).
  - > This grace is for those who are weak: the power to do His will.
    - ✓ This is a greater grace: greater than our desires (cp. 4:1-5) and sin (cp. Rom. 5:20).
    - ✓ This is a timely grace: it comes to us at our time of need (cp. Heb. 4:16).

#### II. WHAT GOD REQUIRES FOR VICTORY (James 4:6b-7; cp. 4:10)

- A. The proper response to yourself: humility (James 4:6b, 10)
  - The contrast in *responses* (cp. Prov. 3:34; I Pet. 5:5)
    - ✓ Proud: one who thinks he is better and greater than others
      - o Not wanting to submit to God's will and thus continuing in his sin
      - One who is self-sufficient, not needing God's grace, can accomplish it in his own strength
    - ✓ Humble: a lowly attitude of dependence on God
      - o Recognizing that he is in desperate need of God's grace
      - o Recognizing his own sinfulness and his own inability to deal with the problem
      - Depending totally on God to work in his life
  - > The contrast in *results* 
    - ✓ God resists the proud.

He arranges Himself against the proud, sets Himself in battle array.

- ✓ God gives grace to the humble.
  - o Grace that enables and empowers the believer (4:6; cp. Heb. 4:16)
    - ❖ In times of sin (Jas. 4:1-6; cp. Rom. 5:20)
    - ❖ In times of struggle (cp. Heb. 4:15-16)
    - ❖ In times of suffering (cp. II Cor. 12:9-10)
    - In times of service (cp. I Pet. 4:10)
  - Grace that exalts the believer (4:10)

- B. The proper response to God: submission (James 4:7a)
  - > An expression of the *humility* just mentioned ("therefore") (cp. 4:6)
  - ➤ Arranging yourself under His *authority* (opposite of "*resists*" 4:6)
  - Submitting yourself to God instead of holding on to selfish desires (cp. 4:1-3)
  - > Submitting your desires, plans, goals, rights, and will to God
- C. The proper response to Satan: resistance (James 4:7b)
  - > The essential recognition of our spiritual enemies (James 4:1-7; cp. 1:14)
    - ✓ The flesh and its desires (4:1-3)
    - √ The world system (4:4)
    - √ The devil (4:7)
  - The required response to the devil (James 4:7b): resistance Taking your stand against him, withstanding him, opposing him
  - > The previous requirement for *resistance* (Jas. 4:7a)
    - ✓ Submitting to God must precede resisting the devil.
    - ✓ Too often we resist God and submit to the devil.
  - ➤ The provided resources for *victory* (cp. Eph. 6:10-18)
    - √ The right power (Eph. 6:10; cp. Eph. 3:16)
    - √ The right defense (Eph. 6:11-17a, 18)
    - ✓ The right offense (Eph. 6:17b; cp. Matt. 4:1-11)
  - ➤ The promised result of *resistance* (James 4:7b): he will *flee* from you.
- o Spiritual victory in your Christian life is impossible through your own strength . . . it requires God's grace.
- o To receive God's grace as a believer, you must be willing to meet God's requirements.
- o God requires humility and submission, recognizing your own desperate need and depending totally on Him.
- o God requires resistance of the devil, as you submit to God and utilize His power.
