I. THE PRACTICAL INSTRUCTION (I Peter 3:8-11)

- A. Instead of focusing on yourself, relate to one another selflessly (I Pet. 3:8).
 - Get along with one another—be harmonious (cp. Rom. 12:16; 15:5; I Cor. 1:10; Phil. 3:16).
 - Demonstrated in being agreeable, not creating conflict or division, disagreeing agreeably, seeking peace and unity
 - A strength of the early Church (Acts 1:14; 2:1, 46; 4:24, 32; 5:12; 8:6; 15:25; Rom. 15:4-6).
 - Feel the same toward one another—show sympathy (cp. Rom. 12:15; I Cor. 12:26; Heb. 13:3).
 - Seeking to place yourself in the situation of one another
 - Using your own experiences to encourage one another
 - Ministering to one another at the level of his/her need
 - Love one another—show brotherly love (cp. I Pet. 1:22; 2:17; Rom. 12:10; Heb. 13:1; II Pet. 1:7; I John 3:14, 18-19).
 - Love demonstrated within family relationships
 - Involves loving, tender affection toward family members (Ro. 12:9-10)
 - > Involves sacrifice of self to meet needs of others (I John 3:16-18; Rom. 12:10)
 - Show compassion toward one another—be tender-hearted (cp. Mt.18:33; Psa.103:13; Eph.4:32).
 - Not being callous, cold-hearted, or hardened to another's pain and suffering
 - > Being sensitive to the needs of others
- B. Instead of seeking revenge, respond to offenses with blessing (I Pet. 3:9).
 - Man's way is repaying....
 - > Evil for good (I Pet. 2:18-23; Psa. 35:11-12; Prov. 17:13)
 - > Evil for evil (I Pet. 3:9; Rom. 12:17; I Thess. 5:15)
 - **➢** Good for good (Matt. 5:46-47)
 - God's way is repaying good for evil (I Pet. 3:9; Matt. 5:39, 43-48; Rom. 12:14, 17-21; I Cor. 12:13; I Thess. 5:15).
 - > It brings blessing (I Pet. 3:9).
 - It is like your Father (Matt. 5:45, 48) and Savior (I Pet. 2:21-23).
 - > It is unlike the world (Matt. 5:46-48).
- C. Instead of not controlling your tongue, refrain from evil speaking (I Pet. 3:10).
 - Control of the tongue is a mark of true religion (Jas. 1:26), but very difficult (Jas.3:1-10).
 - Refrain your tongue from evil and deceit (I Pet. 2:22; John 1:47; Rev. 14:5).
- D. Instead of committing sin, reject evil and do good (I Pet. 3:11a).
 - Do good, even to your enemies (Luke 6:35).
 - Do good to all men, especially to believers (Gal. 6:10).
- E. Instead of promoting conflict, run after peace (I Pet. 3:11b).
 - This is not peace at any price or peace at the expense of biblical truth.
 - This is peace among believers in our relationships which we are exhorted to pursue.

II. THE POWERFUL INCENTIVE (I Peter 3:12)

- A. God's blessing upon the righteous (I Pet. 3:12a)
 - The eyes of the Lord are upon us.
 - > The Lord's care for His own (II Chron.16:9; Psa.33:18-19; cp. Deut.11:11-12; Job 36:5-7)
 - > The Lord's consideration of all our ways (Job 34:21; Psa.11:4-5; Prov.5:21; 15:3; cp. II Sam. 22:25; Job 34:23; Psa. 66:7; Zech. 4:10; Rev .1:14; 2:18; 19:12).
 - The ears of the Lord are directed toward our prayers.
