- I. HE'S LEAVING... Why is He leaving? (John 13:31-32) (The Purpose)
 - A. The importance of the present hour (cp.John 2:4; 7:30; 8:20; 12:23-24,27-28; 17:1)
 - B. The intent of His death and departure: the glory of the Son and the Father (cp. John 12:23-24,27-28; 17:1,5; Phil. 2:5-11)
 - Through *salvation* of sinners (Luke 19:10; I Tim. 1:15)
 - Through bearing sins and taking them away (I Cor. 15:3; II Cor. 5:21; I Jn. 3:5)
 - Through redeeming sinners from penalty/power of sin (Eph.1:7; I Pet. 1:18-19)
 - Through satisfying holy demands against sin (Rom.3:24-25; I John 2:2; 4:9-10)
 - Through offering Himself as a sweet-smelling sacrifice to God (Eph. 5:2)
 - Through completion of the work that the Father had given Him (John 17:4; 19:30)
 - Through destroying *Satan* and His power over death (Heb. 2:14)
 - Through displaying His attributes on the cross (Rom.3:25; II Cor.8:9; I Jn.4:9-10)
 - C. The identity of the Son with the Father (John 13:31-32; cp. 17:4-5)
- HE'S LEAVING... Where is He going? (John 13:33) (The Place) II.
 - A. When He would leave: soon (John 13:33a; cp. 7:33;12:35; 14:19;16:16-19)
 - B. What would occur: separation (John 13:33b)
 - For His disciples, the separation was only temporary (John 13:36; 14:1-3).
 - ❖ For Pharisees and all unbelievers, the separation is eternal (John 8:21-24; cp. II Thess. 1:7-9).
 - C. Where He would go: not stated (John 13:33b; cp. 13:36; 14:4; 16:16-17,28)
- HE'S LEAVING... What should you do when He leaves? (John 13:34-35) III.

Two great priorities: the Great Commission (Matt. 28:18-20) and (The *Priority*) the Great *Command* (John 13:34-35)

- A. The must of love—a command (Jn.13:34-35; 15:12,17; I Jn.2:7-8; 3:23; 4:21; II Jn.5)
- B. The movement of love—moves out toward the other person; should be mutual
- C. The model of love—"as I have loved you" (cp. John 13:12-17; Eph. 5:2; I Jn.4:10-11)
- D. The mark of love—knowing you are disciples by love for one another (13:35; I Jn.3:14)
- E. The manifestation of love—love will be demonstrated (cp.I Cor. 13:4-7; "one anothers")
- F. The maybe of love—"if" (implying the possibility that a Christian will not always love)
- IV. HE'S LEAVING... What will happen before He leaves? (John 13:36-38)
 - A. The confusion of Peter (John 13:36a)—where are you going? (The *Prediction*)
 - B. The commitment of Peter (John 13:36b, 37a; cp. 13:7-9)—why can't I go with you?
 - C. The confidence of Peter (John 13:37b; cp. Matt.26:33-35)—lay down life, never deny
 - D. The correction of Peter (John 13:38)—prediction of what would happen that night
 - - ❖ Beware of making empty *boasts* in your overconfidence.
 - Trials and suffering reveal your level of commitment to Jesus Christ.
 - Your efforts to live for Christ in your own *power* will prove to be fruitless.
- The glory of God is the ultimate purpose of Jesus' death and departure. . . so it should be in all that we do (I Cor. 10:31).
- The separation of Jesus from His disciples was only temporary. . . so it will be with us (John 14:1-3; I Thess. 4:13-18).
- The command of love for one another was given to His disciples. . . so it should be demonstrated by us (John 13:34-35).
- The commitment and confidence of Peter could only be maintained by dependence on Christ. . . so it is with us (John 15:4-5).
