MAIN IDEA: Viewing injustice and death can lead us to see the vanity of life.

- I. THE <u>VANITY</u> OF LIFE: WHY DOES <u>INJUSTICE</u> TRIUMPH? (Eccl. 3:16-18)
  - A. The confusion (3:16; cp. 4:1; 5:8; 8:9; Psa. 73:1-2; Jer. 12:1-2; Hab. 1:2-4): injustice triumphs!
    - Where judgment should be, wickedness is there (3:16a).
    - Where righteousness should be, iniquity is there (3:16b).
  - B. The conclusion (3:17): judgment will come!
    - God's future judgment (3:17a; cp. Rom. 12:17-19; Heb. 10:29-31)
    - God's appointed time (3:17b)
      - > God's ways are not always man's ways.
      - God's time is not always man's time.
    - God's designed purpose (3:18)
- II. THE <u>VANITY</u> OF LIFE: WHY DOES <u>LIFE</u> END AS IT DOES? (Eccl. 3:19-22)
  - A. The confusion (3:19-21; cp. Psa. 49:10-12): Men and animals die!
    - How men and animals are similar (3:19-20)
      - > In how life is conducted (3:19a)
      - > In how life is concluded (3:19b)
      - In how the body is composed (3:20a; cp. Gen. 2:7, 19)
      - In how the body is corrupted (3:20b; cp. Gen. 3:19; Job 34:15; Psa. 104:24-29; 146:3-4)
    - How men and animals are different (3:21)
      - > The spirit of man going up (3:21a; cp. 12:7)
      - The spirit of the animal going down to the earth (3:21b)
  - B. The conclusion (3:22): enjoy life!
    - Enjoy life now (3:22a).
    - Don't worry about *tomorrow*--you don't know what it holds (3:22b; cp. 6:12; 7:14; 9:3; Prov. 27:1; Jas. 4:14).
- Looking at life on the surface can bring great discouragement.
- \* Realizing that injustice will someday end is a great encouragement.
- \* Realizing that death does not end all is our great hope.
- ❖ Enjoying life now in a relationship with the Lord is our great privilege.
